

The Wolseley Centre – 14 June 2026

Our field trip in June was to the Wolseley Centre near Stafford. It is quite a small reserve which is managed by the Staffordshire Wildlife Trust. It consists of four small lakes, woodlands and meadows and it has a wonderful café. The weather was good and we spent a pleasant day exploring the area. We heard Chiffchaffs, Cetti's Warblers, Blackcaps, Blackbirds, Song Thrushes, Nuthatches and Wrens singing and we saw a total of 37 species which are listed below:

Mute Swan, Canada Geese, Greylag Geese, Mallard, Tufted Duck, Lapwing, Pheasant, Jackdaw, Magpie, Rook, Carrion Crow, Raven, Cormorant, Black-headed Gull, Common Tern, Woodpigeon, Moorhen, Kingfisher, Common Buzzard, Song Thrush, Blackbird, Robin, Dunnock, Swallow, Sand Martin, Wren, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Blue Tit, Grey Wagtail, Treecreeper, Little Egret, Blackcap, Garden Warbler, Cetti's Warbler, Reed Bunting, Nuthatch.
